## **Annual General Meeting 20 September 2022**

Elder Judith 'Jacko' Jackson gave a warm Acknowledgement of Country before the formalities. My Chair's Report, followed by the Treasurer's, were read and unanimously accepted. PPCfR's Executive Committee members: Co-Chairs - Rosemary Rule and Dennis Fisher; Treasurer - Fiona Olney-Fraser; Secretary - Deb Stewart; Committee Members - Jo Bond, Joy Bandy, incumbent, and Penelope Demos were re-elected. Guest speaker Nicole Lindsay, CEO of Reconciliation Victoria, gave us a lively and informative overview of RV's activities and plans, including the Yoorrook Justice Commission.

#### Activities

PPCfR's community lunch to commemorate National Sorry Day, held 25 May 2023 at the South Melbourne Community Centre, attracted a record crowd. It included students from Mac.Robertson Girls' High and St Michael's, service organisations U3A and Winja Ulupna, Councillors Heather Consolo and Robbie Nyaguy, and CEO Chris Carroll. Adults and students in Years 9-12 were invited to write on the NAIDOC Week theme 'Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!' Entries were judged by Professor Jeanine Leane, Creative Writing and Aboriginal Literature, University of Melbourne, and Bryan Andy, writer and film maker. The prize winners were announced at a ceremony on 14 October 2022 at South Melbourne Community Centre.

#### **Forum**

The 'Referendum for an Indigenous Voice to Parliament' public event, held on 3 November 2022 at St Kilda Town Hall, featured Indigenous speakers Elder Judith Jackson, Leila Gurruwiwi, Thomas Mayo, Ian Hamm and Uncle Shane Charles and attracted over 150 attendees.

#### **Early Learning Centres Project**

From August 2022, members personally delivered a gift of Fay Stewart-Muir's children's book *Family* to every ELC in the City of Port Phillip, plus a resources list compiled by PPCfR member and ELC educator Fiona Darroch. Feedback was very positive. Several Centres subsequently attended our events and enquired about engaging with local Indigenous providers.

#### **Supporting Reconciliation**

Council: We are grateful for COPP's ongoing support and maintain our close ties, particularly with their Indigenous staff members, through regular contact and meetings. We actively support events including We-Akon Dilinja, Mabo Day and Yalukit Willam Festival and promote all Indigenous-related events in *Mungo*.

A member arranged for Elder Judith 'Jacko' Jackson to speak at Port Melbourne Primary School's assembly. Co-Chairs Rosemary Rule and Dennis Fisher were invited to speak to residents of Australian Unity's Grace retirement complex, Albert Park; both events were held during Reconciliation Week.

Reconciliation Victoria: PPCfR members participated in RV's group network forum, 16 February 2023, and RV and ANTaR Victoria's combined AGM, 6 November 2022, at Federation Square. RV news is regularly featured in *Mungo*.

ANTaR Victoria: Rosemary attended their annual forum in July.
